## **CEES** aims

to validate energy community (EC) actions that uphold energy solidarity and alleviate energy poverty.





# Three interrelated themes (1/3)

## **Energy poverty**

The situation in which households are unable to access affordable 'energy services' that underpin elements of 'human flourishing'.





## Three interrelated themes (2/3)

## **Energy communities**

Collectives that support equitable, democratic and fair transitions towards more local, sustainable and efficient energy systems.





# Three interrelated themes (3/3)

## **Energy solidarity**

Engage with people in energy poverty
Raise awareness of why it exists and its impacts
Lead equitable and fair clean energy transitions
Anchor broader community relationships
Create EC networks for energy solidarity

# Pilot existing measures in other contexts

## **Each Partner agrees to**

- **implement at least one mechanism** that fills a gap in existing programme
- monitor and evaluate opportunities and challenges
- measure impacts for people in energy poverty





# Enercoop / Énergie Solidaire • Financing schemes

- **SUPPORT:** finance action against energy poverty by
  - collecting micro-donations from on energy bills
  - directing value of surplus energy donations

- **IDENTIFY:** which vulnerable customers
- ACT: train employees to assist customers
- ENGAGE: with other entities that offer programmes customers could access
- Inspired by ALlenergy, Repowering London





# Repowering London • Community engagement

### • ENGAGE:

- Diverse actors to leverage services and financing available in community
- Vulnerable households to boost energy know-how and empower them as agents of change

- SUPPORT: add micro-donations, energy surplus and other models as potential funding schemes
- Inspired by énergie solidaire / enercoop





# **ALlenergy** • Affordable warmth

 IDENTIFY: professional targeting linked to 'life' moments

 ACT: advice, home visits/training, behavioral change, energy savings kits

ENGAGE: Referrals network

- SUPPORT: to boost financial security, implement micro-donation and fundraising mechanisms
- Inspired by enercoop / énergie solidaire, Repowering London





# ZEZ • Investor / actor engagement

- ENGAGE:
- Investors keen to advance a just, clean energy transition
- Local entities ready to tackle energy poverty

- IDENTIFY: vulnerable households
- ACT: train young people as energy advisors to visit home and implement energy efficiency kits
- SUPPORT: implement micro-donations
- Inspired by énergie solidaire / enercoop





# Les 7 Vents • Shared, supported self-renovation

- IDENTIFY: vulnerable households
- ACT: hard / soft measures to improve efficiency; boost energy know-how
- **ENGAGE**: diverse actors and build community among people

- **SUPPORT:** to scale-up 3SR approach, test new funding strategies to engage more actors
- Inspired by ALlenergy, Repowering London, énergie solidaire / enercoop





# Coopérnico • Cooperative Ioans

# **SUPPORT:** low-interest lending of capital for RES\*

- to cooperatives to install PV on roofs of charities
- other members for RES for selfconsumption or energy efficiency measures

\* RES = renewable energy sources

- IDENTIFY: vulnerable households
- ACT: build knowledge through energy cafes, implement simple measures
- FUND: seek partners to finance activities
- Inspired by ZEZ, Les 7 Vents





# Demonstrate efficacy of measures to alleviate energy poverty

SURVEY PILOT ASSESS DEPLOY

Across CEES timeframe, **University of Birmingham** and **Rescoop** will help Partners find ways to

- confirm measures implemented are effective
- warrant being scaled up / adapted to different contexts





# **SURVEY • Who is doing what?**

### **Fall 2021**

Asked ECs across Europe about current efforts to tackle energy poverty

100 responses

87% already address energy poverty or would like to

15 selected for in-depth investigation / evaluation for suitability to include in **Energy Solidarity Toolkit** 





# PILOT • Develop ways to monitor / evaluate

2022-23

## Define frameworks to measure degree to which pilots

- fill gaps in existing programmes
- build up new areas of expertise
- need to be adapted to local contexts
- support energy solidarity more broadly.







# **EVALUATE** • Did pilots achieve stated goals?

2023

#### Assess if new mechanisms

- reduced energy poverty and achieved other objectives
- boosted energy solidarity by enhancing health, education, social participation, etc.
- taking account of diversity of populations and contexts
- seeking to identify barriers that hampered implementation





# **DEPLOY • Promote uptake of proven measures**

2023-25

Learnings from survey, pilot and assess will inform the Energy Solidarity Toolkit.

**To empower ECs**, Toolkit will include proven mechanisms across the scope of:

**IDENTIFY • ENGAGE • ACT • SUPPORT • MEASURE**
